*ACCT 5700 Advanced Business Law is considered a non-accounting course according to the Georgia State Board of Public Accountancy and AACSB, but the content in this course is heavily tested on the Regulation section of the Uniform CPA exam.

IMPORTANT NOTES:

To be eligible for the Auburn MAcc Program, candidates must have a four-year undergraduate degree from an accredited university. Candidates must have also completed the business and accounting foundation courses outlined above. In addition, a candidate's academic background in accounting must be U.S. based which would include having studied U.S. Generally Accepted Accounting Principles (GAAP), Generally Accepted Auditing Standards (GAAS), and the Internal Revenue Code.

The Auburn MAcc Program is a professional non-thesis degree program requiring 30 semester hours of coursework. Campus and online students are required to participate in a two and one-half day campus residency during the final spring semester of the program beginning on the last Wednesday through Friday of April. During the residency, students will participate in the Auburn MAcc Leadership Summit which is comprised of business seminars, leadership workshops, and social events.

Applicants must have completed the business and accounting foundation courses prior to enrollment in the MAcc Program.
