SCMN4700 is a project based, work intensive senior-level course, and <u>requires application of</u> what you have learned in the above mentioned foundation courses.

Course Structure: Approximately 1/3 of our class time is based on lab work for data mining and simulation activities related to course assignments. Classroom time will be devoted to lecture *and* discussion of supply chain strategies, as well as application of these concepts through in-class activities. *Everyone is expected to participate in team work and be prepared to contribute to the discussions in the classroom.*

Student Responsibilities: Grades for the course are based on performance in the following four areas.

- 1. **Exams:** There will be two exams during the semester. They will consist of multiple choice and short answer questions. Questions will emphasize the ability to analyze/synthesize reading materials, class discussions, presentations, and related assignments.
- 2. Class Project and Presentation: Each person will participate in a major project analysis (as part of a four person team) from August to October. At the start of November, each team will make a formal presentation of their findings/recommendations.
- 3. Class Participation: There will be a variety of discussions, assignments, and activities throughout the semester which will emphasize the ability to investigate and apply key concepts. <a href="Attendance and active engagement is necessary to "participate" in these activities. Participation grade also includes effort and contribution to class project team activities, as judged by peer evaluations.
